

Basic Round Stitch Instructions

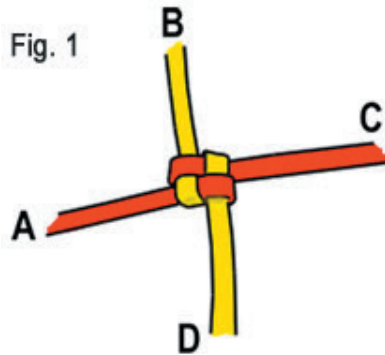


Fig. 1-
Begin with the basic starter stitch. It may be easiest to number or letter the strands to follow along.

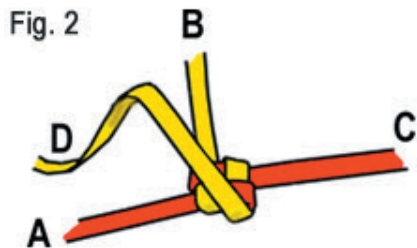


Fig. 2-
You can start with any strand. Seen here, you fold strand D towards strand B at an angle. Rest strand D to the left of strand B.

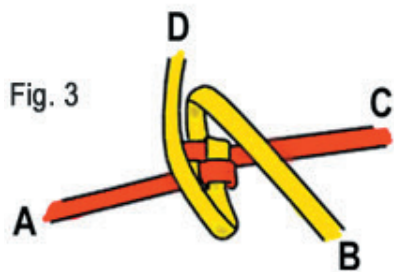


Fig. 3-
Fold strand B at a diagonal towards the fold/loop of strand D. Rest strand to the right of strand D. It is important that the lines do NOT cross; keep same-colors parallel.

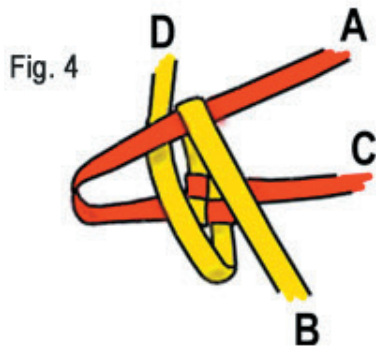

With strand A, fold it over strand D and under strand B.
Rest this strand close to the fold/loop.

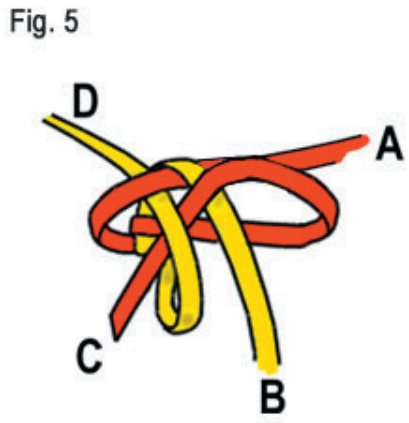

Take strand C and fold it over strand B and under strand D.
Rest this strand close to the fold/loop.

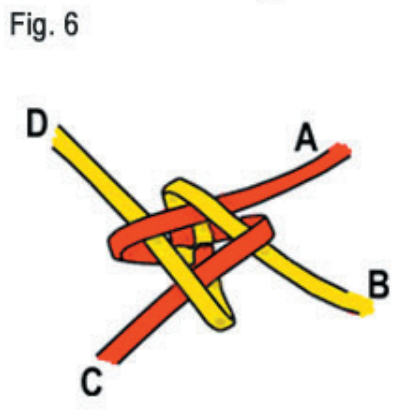

Grasp all the ends and pull. Tug tightly to complete the first stitch.

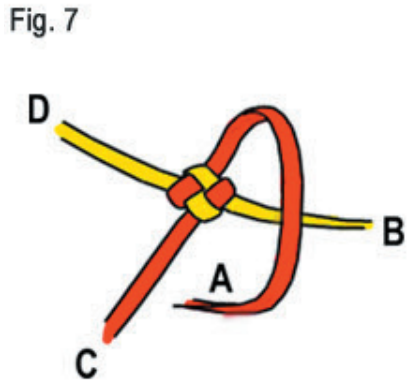

Continue with the next layer. You will repeat steps 2-6.
Grasp strand A and fold it towards strand C. Rest strand A to the right of strand C.

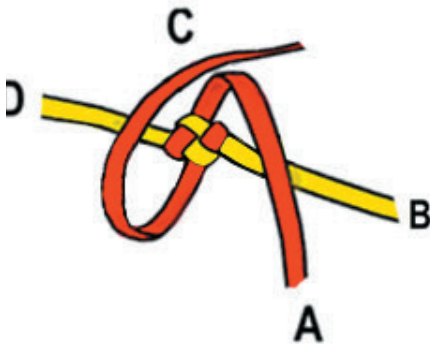

Fold strand C towards the fold/loop of strand A. Rest strand C to the left of strand A. Again, it is important that the lines do NOT cross.

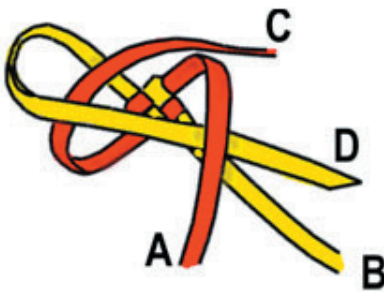

With strand D, fold it over strand C and under strand A. Rest this strand next to the fold/loop.

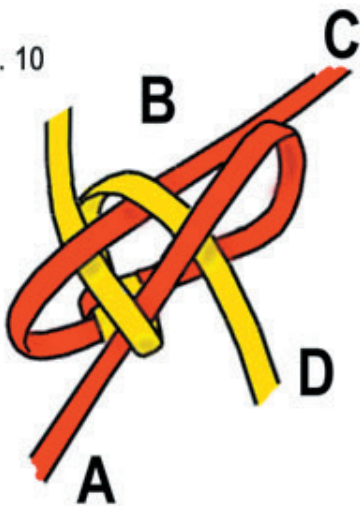

Take strand B and fold it over strand A, and under strand C. Rest this strand close to the fold/loop.

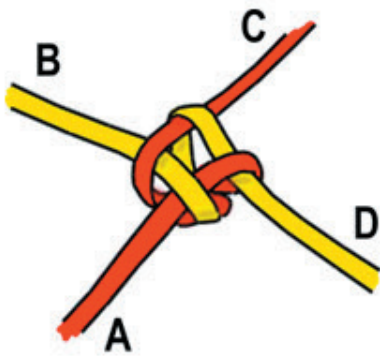

Grasp all the ends and pull. Tug tightly to completing another stitch.

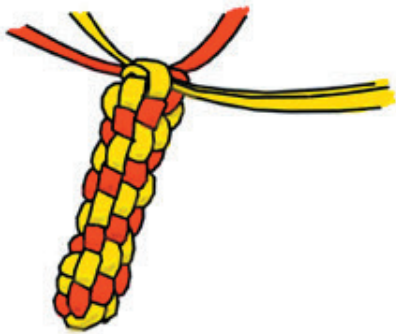

Continue until you've achieved the desired length. Remember to keep same-color strands from crossing and try to prevent the lines from twisting before you tighten each layer.
